

Made by Benjamin Platt, New Milford, Connecticut. Platt was a worker in gold, silver, and brass. Besides surveying instruments he also made clocks. Platt moved his residence several times; this particular compass was probably made about 1802 when he lived in New Milford.




Made by Augustus Platt, Columbus, Ohio. Platt, and his father, Benjamin, also a well-known instrument maker, moved to Columbus about 1817 where he died in 1886. Benjamin died in 1833, so the above transit was probably made between that date and 1843 when the company was known as "Platt and Son" (Augustus' son William).

Made by Benjamin Rittenhouse, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Rittenhouse held several positions for the State of Pennsylvania. In 1796 he made a surveyor's chain by order of Congress which has remained the standard measure to this day. This compass was made in 1787.
